<b>課程說明</b>	<p>一、本系以培養敬業服務態度與職場倫理、旅遊及休閒運動專業技能、多元視野與終身學習能力為教育目標。依產業需求與課程規劃，強調實務技能與學用接軌，致力培育觀光旅遊及休閒運動服務管理人才，以「適性點亮人才、契合樂活休閒產業需求」為特色發展基礎。</p> <p>二、本專班規劃以『觀光旅遊』及『休閒運動』為二大發展主軸。『觀光旅遊』及『休閒運動』二大發展主軸說明如下：(一) 休閒運動：結合運動實務經驗與運動科學理論，融入服務與管理知識，能為團體活動規劃執行，並針對個人體適能提供專業診斷與建議。(二) 觀光旅遊：透過參與、合作與共享，整合多元知識，採體驗式與行動學習方式，包含校內實習、產學合作導覽、海外參訪及遊程設計競賽等，以培育務實致用之專業人才。</p>

<b>華語文課程 (線上或校內課程)</b>	本專班安排為期一年的實用中文(一)(二)、生活華語(一)(二)、語言輔導(一)(二)等課程，由本校安排專門華語文授課教師授課。華語文教師聘任符合教育部聘任規範，由具備國內外大專校院碩士以上學位，並具有教育部對外華語教學能力證書，或是具備國內外中國語文學、臺灣文學或語言教學相關系所碩士以上學位，並於國內外大學對外華語教學師資培訓班修習120小時以上之華語文師資。

<b>實習方式</b>	<p>一、校外實習(一)(二)(三)(四)(五)(六)安排於二年級至四年級，因課程學習需要參與境內之校外實習課程，每週實習時數約13至14小時。</p> <p>二、實習津貼與福利</p> <p>■實習津貼：實習合作廠商將給予不低於基本薪資的實習津貼(視實習天數計算除以當月工作日)或以基本時薪計。</p> <p>■福利：員工餐、三節獎金、生日獎品、公司聚餐等。</p> <p>三、實習機構：</p> <p>(一)凱撒國際管理顧問有限公司：凱撒國際管理顧問股份有限公司由宏國關係事業於2013年成立，專注於旅館經營管理、規劃與開發，主要業務涵蓋各級旅館之籌建與資源整合。宏國自1988年接手台北希爾頓酒店起跨足旅宿業，迄今已建立擁有10家飯店、逾3,000間客房的凱撒飯店連鎖，涵蓋五星級度假酒店、觀光旅館、商務飯店與精品酒店，為臺灣規模居前的飯店集團。</p> <p>(二)香港商世界健身事業有限公司臺灣分公司自2001年進軍臺灣，致力推廣現代健身中心經營模式，打造專業健康的運動環境。2010年收購加州健身6家據點後快速擴張，至2022年已發展為全臺最大連鎖健身品牌，擁有逾百家大型俱樂部。</p>		
<b>在學工讀</b>	實習課程以外，倘取得在臺工作證後，於學期期間，每週工讀以20小時為限；寒暑假期間則不限。		
<b>就業輔導</b>	本系有關學生之就業輔導機制之實施及配套措施，分四個階段進行輔導： <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. 探索期：本校透過UCAN職業興趣探索、生涯輔導與職涯活動，協助學生了解人格特質、個性取向、學習狀況與生涯方向；並由諮商中心提供多元心理測驗，支持學生自我認識與規劃。</li> <li>2. 本系透過專業課程與證照輔導，強化學生核心能力，並積極鼓勵參與專業技術證照考試。本校自94學年度起訂定「技能檢定及專業證照獎學金實施要點」，依證照等級提供獎學金，以提升學生專業技術能力。</li> </ol>		

	<p>3. 強化期：(1)實務專題演講：邀請企業主管、成功人士與傑出校友，分享生涯規劃、產業趨勢、就業市場及求職技巧，並進行履歷自傳撰寫訓練。(2)企業實地參訪：由教師帶領學生至企業參訪，了解實際運作與經營理念，拓展視野並加深對職場生態的認識。</p> <p>4. 確定期：(1)企業校園徵才：邀請企業來校徵才，提供展示、面試與即時求才服務，提升就業媒合率。(2)畢業生就業調查：定期追蹤畢業前與畢業後1年的就業狀況，並蒐集校友及雇主回饋。(3)勞動部就業學程：爭取補助，開設履歷撰寫、面試技巧、產業分析與職涯規劃課程。(4)實習即就業：與雄獅旅遊及其他企業合作，學生經嚴格篩選參與實習，畢業後可直接轉任正職。</p>

<b>Program</b>	Department of Leisure Business Management
<b>Program Description</b>	<p>1. The educational objectives of this department are: (1) to cultivate a dedicated service attitude and workplace ethics; (2) to acquire professional knowledge and skills in tourism and leisure sports; and (3) to broaden diverse perspectives and foster lifelong learning. Based on industry needs, professional development, faculty expertise, and curriculum planning, we uphold the principles of "practical skills" and "reducing the learning-application gap" to cultivate practical and effective tourism, leisure sports service, and management talents. Our distinctive development is based on the principle of "adaptively igniting talents and meeting the needs of the leisure and leisure industry."</p> <p>2. This program is planned to focus on "tourism" and "leisure sports" as two major development axes. These two development axes are explained as follows: (1) Leisure Sports: The department applies knowledge development in the field of leisure sports. This combines practical experience in leisure sports with theoretical knowledge in sports science with the department's foundational knowledge in "service" and "management." We plan and implement customized events for related organizations. We can also provide scientific and professional diagnosis and advice based on individual exercise conditions and fitness levels. (2) Tourism: Faculty and students in the department integrate diverse knowledge systems through participation, discussion, collaboration, and sharing, aiming to cultivate practical and applicable talents. This is achieved through experiential and multifaceted learning and action learning. This includes student participation in on-campus internships, industry-university collaborations (campus guided tours and interpretation activities, campus ecological guided tours), overseas visits, and the creation of tour competition entries to achieve knowledge integration and unleash creativity.</p>

<b>Mandarin courses (online or on-campus courses)</b>	<p>This one-year program offers courses such as Practical Chinese (I) and (II), Daily Chinese (I) and (II), and Language Guidance (I) and (II). These courses are taught by dedicated Chinese language teachers assigned by the school. Chinese language teachers are hired in accordance with the Ministry of Education's recruitment standards and must hold a master's degree or higher from a domestic or international college and possess a Ministry of Education Certificate in Teaching Chinese as a Foreign Language, or a master's degree or higher from a domestic or international university in Chinese language and literature, Taiwanese literature, or language teaching, and have completed at least 120 hours of training at a domestic or international university for teaching Chinese as a foreign language.</p>

Students must participate in off-campus internships within the country to meet course requirements. The internship duration is 40 hours per week.</li> <li>2. Caesar International Management Consultants Caesar International Management Consultants Co., Ltd. was established in 2013 by the Hung Kuo Group, focusing on hotel operation, management, planning, and development. Its core business covers the construction and resource integration of various types of hotels. Since taking over the Taipei Hilton Hotel in 1988, the Hung Kuo Group has expanded into the hospitality industry and has developed the Caesar Hotels chain, comprising 10 hotels with more than 3,000 guest rooms. The chain includes five-star resorts, luxury tourist hotels, business hotels, and boutique hotels, making it one of the leading hotel groups in Taiwan.</li> <li>(2). World Gym Taiwan Branch: In 2001, World Gym officially entered Taiwan and actively introduced its modern fitness center business model to various locations across the country, aiming to provide Taiwanese residents with a healthier and more professional fitness environment. <b>Work-study During Semester</b>	In addition to the internship course, after obtaining a work permit in Taiwan, the maximum weekly work-study hours during the semester is 20 hours; there is no limit during winter and summer vacations.		
<b>Employment Counseling</b>	<p>The implementation of the career guidance mechanism and supporting measures for students in the department are divided into four phases:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Exploration Period: The university provides UCAN career interest assessments, career counseling, and related activities to help students better understand their personality traits, personal orientations, learning conditions, and career directions. In addition, the Counseling Center offers a variety of psychological assessments to support students in self-understanding and career planning.</li> <li>2. Through professional courses and certification counseling, the department strengthens students' core competencies and actively encourages them to take professional certification exams. Since the 2005 academic year, the university has implemented the "Regulations for Skill Certification and Professional License Scholarships," offering scholarships based on certification levels to enhance</li> </ol>		

	<p>students' professional and technical abilities.</p> <p>3. Intensive period: (1) Practical Thematic Lectures: Industry executives, successful professionals, and distinguished alumni are invited to share insights on career planning, industry trends, employment markets, and job-seeking skills, as well as provide training in résumé and autobiography writing.(2) Corporate Field Visits: Faculty members lead students to visit enterprises, enabling them to understand real-world operations and management concepts, broaden their horizons, and gain deeper awareness of workplace dynamics.</p> <p>4. Confirmation period: (1) On-Campus Recruitment: Enterprises are invited to the university to conduct recruitment activities, including company presentations, interviews, and on-the-spot hiring, to improve job-matching effectiveness.(2) Graduate Employment Survey: Employment status is regularly tracked before graduation and one year after graduation, with feedback collected from alumni and employers.(3) Ministry of Labor Employment Program: With government subsidies, courses are offered on résumé writing, interview skills, industry analysis, and career planning.(4) Internship-to-Employment Program: In collaboration with Lion Travel and other enterprises, students selected through a rigorous process participate in internships, with the opportunity to transition to full-time employment upon graduation.</p>
