As of 2025, the minimum hourly wage is NT\$190. For monthly compensation, the minimum remuneration for performing labor in line with the statutory maximum of 40 working hours per week is NT\$28,590 per month. ■ Benefits: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (1). The Caesar Hotel Group provides interns with benefits such as staff meals and dining discounts. (2).
